The names and locations of the main seas/oceans in and around Europe: (Mediterranean Sea lies to the south of Europe, Atlantic Ocean lies to the west of Europe Arctic Ocean lies to the north of Europe, the English Channel lies between the UK and France, the Baltic Sea is enclosed in the north of Europe and the Black Sea is located in western Europe).
