There's a lovely lack of stereotyping on gender and backstory for the narrator, which adds to the message of not judging people before you know them.</p> <p>Courage: The children stand up for Ahmet. Hope: They believe they can help him find his family. Compassion: Their empathy drives the story.</p>	<p>The Infinite By Patience Agbabi</p> <p>Leaplings, children born on the 29th of February, are very rare. Rarer still are Leaplings with The Gift - the ability to leap through time. Elle Bibi-Imbelé Ifié has The Gift, but she's never used it. Until now. On her twelfth birthday, Elle and her best friend Big Ben travel to the Time Squad Centre in 2048. Elle has received a mysterious warning from the future. Other Leaplings are disappearing in time - and not everyone at the centre can be trusted.</p> <p>Courage: Elle uses her time-travel gift to help others. Hope: She believes she can change the future.
